

Background

When Nehemiah heard of Jerusalem's horrible condition, he prayed to the Lord for wisdom and then approached King Artaxerxes for the chance to return and rebuild the walls (1:1-2:10). Once back in Jerusalem, Nehemiah inspected the walls and motivated the people to undertake the work (2:11-3:32). Not everyone was pleased with the progress, however. Opposition to God's people arose, yet Nehemiah persevered in the work (4:1-23). In Nehemiah 5, a new challenge arises—conflict within the community.

Study Questions

Read Nehemiah 5:1-19

- 1. What caused the outcry within the community?
- 2. What did Nehemiah do in response to the outcry?
- 3. What was the result of Nehemiah confronting those who were perpetuating injustice?
- 4. How did Nehemiah set the example for the rest of the people?

Application Questions

- 1. Why do you think some people turn a blind eye to the injustices happening around them?
- 2. When have you been tempted to ignore injustice? Why is it important for God's people to pursue justice?
- 3. How can we set an example of godly living and leadership for those around us?
- 4. How does the gospel demonstrate the clearest demonstration of God's justice while also holding out the hope of forgiveness and restoration?
